ACTION TUTORING

Guide for schools

Action Tutoring is an award-winning education charity that supports young people facing socio-economic disadvantage to achieve a meaningful level of academic attainment.

We partner with non-selective state schools across England to deliver maths and English tutoring programmes for pupils sitting their SATs and GCSEs, working specifically with pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding and at risk of not reaching national standards by the time they leave primary or secondary school.

We select and train high-quality volunteer tutors, who use our specially designed resources to deliver impactful tutoring.

Our provision includes:



8 to 10 high-quality, DBS-checked and trained volunteer tutors to work with up to 20 Year 5, 6, 7, 10 or 11 pupils.



Structured pupil and tutor resources, developed by curriculum specialists specifically for tutoring sessions.



A dedicated Programme Coordinator to induct and engage pupils, provide CPD and quality assurance for our tutors, and liaise with the school.



Our programmes are heavily subsidised by fundraising, meaning we can offer provision from as little as ± 10 per pupil per hour.

Pupil progress analysis and reporting for schools.

Delivery options

We offer face-to-face, online and virtual programmes for Year 5, 6, 7, 10 and 11 pupils.



Face-to-face: Our tutors are on the school premises for the session, along with a staff member from our team.



Online: Pupils connect with their tutors via our online platform, using computers in your school. A member of our staff team oversees the sessions in-person.




Virtual: Runs like an online programme, but both the tutors and Action Tutoring staff member log in remotely. Virtual programmes allow us to help disadvantaged pupils further outside of our hubs.

Jo Cooper, Deputy Headteacher, Bramcote College in Nottingham In 2022-23, after ten or more sessions with Action Tutoring disadvantaged pupils were more likely to achieve the expected standards than other disadvantaged pupils across the country — by 7 percentage points in reading and 14 percentage points in maths.






Research shows that small-group tuition is a powerful tool for accelerating pupil progress, especially when tailored to individual needs. Studies have found that pupils can benefit from as much as four months' additional progress, with evidence that the benefits may be particularly relevant for disadvantaged pupils.

Our impact - GCSEs

In 2022-23, after ten or more sessions with Action Tutoring, 65% of disadvantaged pupils passed their maths GCSE. Our pupils were nearly 13 percentage points more likely to pass maths GCSE than other disadvantaged pupils nationally.

Action Tutoring ran a smaller Year 11 English programme in 2022–23, with 75 disadvantaged pupils attending ten or more tutoring sessions. While these pupils appear to have achieved a similar pass rate as previous years, Action Tutoring judged the sample to be too small to carry out robust comparative analysis with the national pass rate.

Who are our tutors?

Our volunteer tutors go through a strict selection process which focuses on their academic credentials and core tutoring competencies. We also complete DBS checks for them.





Our tutors attend an initial two-hour training session and receive ongoing developmental support from their Programme Coordinator, and access to all the training materials in our tutor resources library.
